REPORT ON CONSTITUTIONAL DAY CELEBRATION:

Every year on November 26th, we celebrate Constitution Day across the country to commemorate the adoption of India's constitution. The Constituent Assembly of India adopted the Indian Constitution on November 26, 1949, and it was implemented on January 26, 1950. Simultaneously, on November 19, 2015, the central government's Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment announced that November 26 would be designated as Constitution Day every year.

This day is dedicated to Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. He was the chairman of the Constitution Drafting Committee. His tireless efforts in drafting the constitution earned him the title "Father of the Indian Constitution." As a tribute to this great person, the year 2015 marked the 125th birth anniversary of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, which has been observed as Constitution Day.

The prime minister of India, Narendra Modi, announced that the 26th of November will be observed in various government departments, organizations, and educational institutions. He also declared that 26th of November was not a holiday, speaking about this occasional day in school and college with various speeches, debate competitions, quizzes, and so on, to promote student awareness and understanding of our constitution.

Mrs. Sasikala, Dr. Sr. Sheeja Vayola, and Mrs. Annapriya graciously organized the program. We began the celebration at 11.30 a.m. with the welcome address, in which we welcomed the secretary, Rev. 
