# **Guest Lectures and Departmental Association Activities**

#### **Examinations**

The academic performance of B.Ed. and M.Ed. students is evaluated through continuous assessment comprising of two internal tests, online tests, assignments, seminars, student interaction, and End-Semester examinations. The B.Ed, M.Ed, and M.Phil students secured 100% pass. The practical commission for second-year B.Ed students was organized on 30<sup>th</sup> January 2018.





# **Extension Activities Socially Useful Productive Work**

The student teachers are provided with ample opportunity to train them to develop their skills in fashion jewelry, embroidery, mirror work, sanitizers, liquid soaps, paper mache products, paper crafts, and handicraft items. To enhance these skills the students are given hands-on training.

## Women's Cell (WC)
